## What Are Deafhood and Audism?


Amanda Tuite came to speak to us on April 13<sup>th</sup>. She encouraged us to read a book titled *"Understanding Deaf Culture: In Search of Deafhood"* by Paddy Ladd. One of the book's main aims is achieving Deaf unity. Deafhood is valued in both the hearing and deaf worlds. Paddy Ladd also has an ASL video for deaf people to watch. Deafhood is described as a journey that each Deaf person undertakes to discover their true identity and purpose here on Earth as a Deaf person. We are visually oriented in dealing with the environment. We feel most at ease using a signed language rather than a spoken language. If you fit that

description, you have begun the search for Deafhood. The degree of your hearing or speaking ability does not matter. Each person's search for deafhood occurs at all levels: physical, emotional, mental, spiritual, cultural and linguistic. According to Ladd, deafhood requires Deaf people to evaluate and liberate themselves from the oppression they have faced historically from the majority of hearing society.

Amanda then talks about "Audism". That word is defined as discrimination that is based on a person's ability, or lack of ability, to hear. Discrimination against deafness can exist in all areas including deaf education and is known as audism. People who are deaf may feel that institutions are trying to destroy or oppress deaf culture. This type of audism limits deaf culture and pride. This is done by creating an environment in which deaf people must conform to the ways of hearing society. It greatly impacts deaf education in terms of shunning American Sign Language in favor of communication that is based on the English language and more acceptable to people who are able to hear.

The true success of Deafhood is when Deaf People feel "at home" with being Deaf and find other Deaf people in their visual orientation and use of Sign Language. When we are secure with our own natural language and community, we can be healthier, more creative and more able to embrace the diversity that surrounds us.

Editor's Note — Interesting fact about goats perching on the tree.

The trees in question are *Argania spinosa*, or argan, a species endemic to Morocco and a small region of western Algeria. Goats are drawn to the argan's fruit, which ripens in June each year. They have no qualms about scampering to the top of the 30-foot-tall trees in search of a feast, and will stand on a skinny branch post-nosh, looking blissed out and whinnying softly.

The small, firm argan fruit has a thick peel and pulp surrounding an almondshaped nut. When a goat eat

the fruit, this nut passes through its digestive system whole and eventually gets excreted. Traditionally, members of the indigenous Berber population would gather nuts from the goat droppings, crack them open with stones, then roast and grind the seeds inside. The argan oil extracted from this process is high in essential fatty acids and vitamin E, and has long been used locally as a skin treatment and cooking ingredient.


