# In Memoriam

We Seniors of 1951 respectfully dedicate THE TOWERS to the memory of Dr. J. W. Blattner, who for sixty

years devoted his time, ability, and interest to education of the deaf.

## "Here was a man to hold against the world, a man to match the mountains and the sea."

Dr. Blattner, a nationally known pioneer in the education of the deaf, came to the Texas School for the Deaf in 1885 and was principal for 27 years, the position now held by his son-in-law, Mr. O.L.McIntire. His daughter Mary Ann McIntire is one of our advanced teachers. While here, Dr. Blattner edited the Lone Star, built up a fine staff of teachers, organized classes for teachers-in-training, devised a method of teaching is elementary sounds, prepared the first formal course of instruction for schools for the deaf, and pioneered in preparing text books for

for schools for the deaf, and pioneered in preparing text books for the instruction of the deaf children.

On Sunday mornings, Dr Blattner delivered in the language of signs beautiful sermons which would have been a credit to any minister. He was a tireless worker--active, keen of mind, and deeply interested in the deaf to the end of his days.

The deaf lost a dear friend on August 23, 1950, when Dr Blattner died at the age of ninety-two. Dr. Blattner was truly a great man. He looked to God for all he needed to help him carry on--for solace in his sorrow and courage in the dawn--because he want to be with Him for all eternity.

E. R. Wright, son of deaf parents, was born and reared on farm in Trinity County, Texas. After completing high school he entered am Houston State Teachers College, where he majored in Government and Sociology and received his B. S. degree in 1935. After the time he received his degree he was granted certificate to teach in all schools in Texas. In 1938 he was elected by the people of the 29th District to represent them in the Legislature and served during the long season in 1939 at which time he tendered his resignation to accept position as Superintendent of The Texas School for the Deaf.

Mr. Wright's mother is an ex-student of The Texas School for the Deaf, having entered the school in 1884.






