On April 26, we visited the Varner-Hogg Plantation State Historic Site, managed by the Texas Historical Commission. This site served as the residence of James S “Jim” Hogg, the governor of Texas from 1891 to 1895.

We walked around the grounds and entered the plantation house, which was mostly empty but undergoing restoration work. We also toured the cistern next to the sugar mill ruins; it had been destroyed, along with several other buildings on the site, by the 1900 Galveston hurricane.

Additionally, we visited the Hogg cottage house, a barn filled with antique items, and a gift shop with an artifacts room where a presentation video can also be viewed.

Lastly, we explored the Patton cemetery in the back, where four Patton family members were buried almost 200 years ago. The Pattons lived there after Varner’s and Jim Hogg’s times.



You can read about the place on Wikipedia by typing "Varner-Hogg Plantation State Historic Site" in the search bar, and you can also look up the town on Wikipedia to learn about its history.

After touring the site, we returned to the bus and headed to Elmo’s Grill in town for lunch; the food was quite good (the restaurant is similar to Dairy Queen).

We had planned to visit the Columbia Historical Museum and the replica of the first Texas Capitol building; however, both locations were closed due to a series of town events, including a historical reenactment, early voting for the city elections, a shrimp boil and fish fry, and an auction.

On our way back to town, we stopped by La Michoacana Natural Ice Cream in Rosenberg, where we enjoyed ice cream treats to complete our field trip.
