ALZHEIMER'S AWARENESS

On August 9th, Joel Silva with Houston Health Department spoke to us about the difference between Alzheimer's and Dementia.

Alzheimer's is on the rise and a higher risk for seniors. It's a progressive brain disorder that causes cell damage and memory loss.

This neurodegenerative disease causes a gradual declines in memory, memory loss, planning problem solving, and task difficulty. It is formed from proteins that hurt the brain cells and prevent cell communication.

The senior can become angry, act depressed, and hide things. Daily activities such as walking, bathing, dressing, and eating require assistance. It can be from genetics if your family has a history of it. There is no cure for Alzheimer's, but treatments are available.

Dementia is a general term for declining memory, reasoning, or other thinking skills.

There are support groups and caregivers to help. This is a safe place to find emotional support. Call the Alzheimer's Association at 800-272-3900 for help, local support groups, and education assistance.

Google: What is a tube shunt in glaucoma surgery?

Glaucoma tube shunts are small devices implanted into the eye to drain excess fluid. The tube portion of the device is inserted into the eye to create a drain for aqueous fluid. The tube shunt surgery aims to decrease eye pressure and vision loss due to glaucoma.

One day, I craved a homemade chocolate cookie and remembered my old recipe that was not required to bake. It is No Bake Cookies, and there is no need to use an oven to bake them! It satisfies my chocoholic.

No Bake Cookies

- 2 cups sugar $\frac{1}{2}$ cup peanut butter
- 1 stick butter
- 3 cups uncooked quick oats
- 3 T cocoa 1 teaspoon vanilla
- $\frac{1}{2}$ cup milk

Cook first 4 ingredients, stirring constantly until mixture comes to a boil. Remove from heat and add last 3 ingredients. Mix well and drop by spoonfuls onto wax paper.
