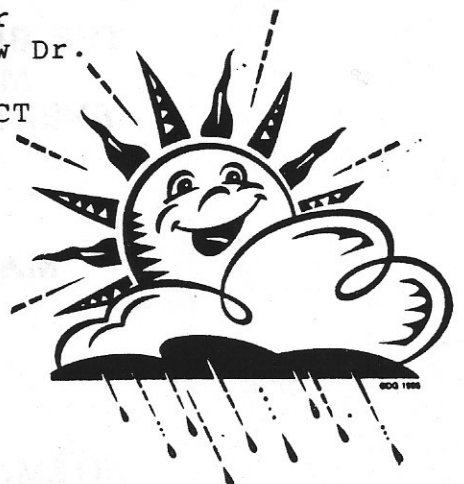
Everything was very good. Big thanks goes to Officer Randy Melton and the committees for their hard work to make everything so success.
