January 9, 2004



#### Sea Center Texas Life Support Equipment

Those equipment are pumping the dirt out of the water. There are several kind of filters including ozone treatment that the pump has to process from fish tanks to fish tanks to get clean water for the fishes.

Those big tanks hold two to five fishes depending on the size of female and male that are to be mated. The eggs would be floating toward outside of the sink next to the tanks; the workers would then start taking care of the fishes to be grown four to six inches long before releasing them into the Gulf.



#### Annie Jump Cannon 1863 – 1941

Curator of Astronomical Photography Harvard Observatory

Annie Jump Cannon catalogued more than 250,000 stars by studying the spectrum of each star from photographs. Her research restructured the classification system for stars - in the Henry Draper Catalogue - which continues to be used by astronomers to this day.

As part of the Draper Catalogue team, she worked with a large group of women at the Harvard Observatory to study photos of stellar spectral fields. After more than ten years working on the project she was appointed Curator of the collection of photographs.

Deafness, caused by an illness in her youth, was an advantage for her work. By removing her hearing aids she could work without distractions, enabling her to classify 120 stars every hour. She thinks of the stars' compositions as the architecture of the celestial mansions and their classification as the streaming of celestial tribes.
