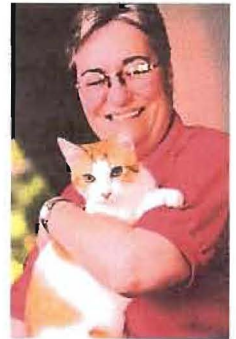

## **Cats act as ears for deaf woman**

Betty Macaluso, 68, holds her cat, Tom 2, at her Lawrenceville home. Macaluso is deaf so the cat wakes her up in the morning and functions as her ears. Therefore, Betty doesn't need an alarm clock. If Tom 2 happens to sleep through his job or gets distracted, Tiger steps in. Both cats are 1 year old and were adopted from PetsMart in Lawrenceville when they were 3 months. One morning, Tom 2 stood on her stomach gazing up at the ceiling above her bed. A week went by and she noticed Tom 2 often staring up at the same spot. When Macaluso shined a flashlight over the area that held the cat's attention, she saw a thin, round line of clay on her ceiling. She immediately called pest control. Tom 2 had detected termites. The exterminator told Macaluso that she was lucky to have a cat like Tom 2. She would have lost her home if he hadn't detected the termites. Macaluso remembers one evening when she was a young girl sitting down with her Mother (also deaf) on the swing on their porch. They noticed the cat acting strangely. Until the cat began fighting with a rattlesnake that lay 5 feet away from Macaluso and her Mother, did they realized that their cat had saved them from being bitten. She wrote that she would never live without cats because they always helped her by hearing what she cannot.

## **Ed's Telecom Alert has posted a new item, 'Julius Genachowski - New FCC Chair'**

Julius Genachowski was sworn in as chairman of the Federal Communications Commission, beginning a tenure that is expected to bring more attention to new mobile and internet technologies. He has been widely lauded for his experience in Washington as an entrepreneur and later as an investor. He served 2 clerkships and as general counsel for former FCC chairman Reed Hundt. Later, he became an executive for AIC/InterActive, which bought several internet firms and founder of LaunchBox Digital and venture capital firm Rock Creek Ventures. He chose as his chief of staff, Edward Lazarus, a relative unknown in the telecommunications industry. Lazarus comes from the law firm Akin Gump, where is supervised the Lost Angeles office of 800 employees and was the co-head of the firm's global litigation practice. He also appointed 2 senior advisors - Colin Crowell and Bruce Gottleib. Genachowski has several issues lined up for his start. He will have to come up with a national broadband plan that not only connects all homes to high-speed internet, but also addresses issues of affordability and lack of training on how to use the Web.
