This month we went to Nacogdoches to visit the Old Stone Fort and Sterne-Hoya House Museum & Library. First stop: the Fort,



built in 1779 on Old San Antonio Road, it was first a mercantile house and later became a courthouse. Dismantled



in 1902, some of the original materials were used to build the replica, which now stands on the campus of Stephen F. Austin

University. An interesting fact was the two story structure featured doors from each room leading outside, as originally there were no interior doors to connect the rooms.

After a plentiful buffet at Barnhill & Steak Restaurant, we were off to the Sterne-Hoya House. Believed to be the oldest Pier and Beam frame house in the area and still standing on its original site, it was built around 1830. Furnished with antiques from earlier era's, there was a small library in one room. We learned from the ledger kept when it was a trading store, that Sam Houston bought "frogs" frequently when he stopped in, or in other words, "whiskey!"

Everyone enjoyed the museums, the food, and the company, so we hope to see some new faces join us in the upcoming trips!

Became Great-Grandmother twice in 5 days



Hit-and-Run Kills Man During Morning Jog

AUSTIN -- Orange paint marks still mark the spot on the road where police say a man struck



a jogger and kept driving. Investigators found the man's crashed vehicle, but the driver got away. Family members say the jogger was Mark Gobble, who had worked as a history teacher at the Texas School of the

Deaf.

Gobble was jogging around 6:30 a.m. Sunday when police say a car left the road and hit him near the intersection of Slaughter Lane and Escarpment Boulevard. Witnesses say his body landed about 30 feet away. A doctor who lives nearby administered CPR.

"I was gonna follow the guy, see where he went, but I looked over and saw a guy on the ground," the neighbor said.

Gobble was taken to University Medical Center Brackenridge where he later died.

Gobble's wife, who only communicates with sign language, told KVUE she hopes whoever did this to her husband is brought to justice.

The driver was in a gray Toyota pickup. Police say the driver is a man in his mid 20's and was wearing a light colored T-shirt. If you have any information in the case, call Austin police.


Dressing:
